#### GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS David J. Cameron July 2022

To the Officers and Members of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Ancient, Free and Accepted Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Brethren,

Welcome to the one hundred and sixty-seventh Annual Communication of our Grand Lodge.

I welcome the Worshipful Masters of our Constituent Lodges who have joined us. Freemasonry exists, has its life and being, in the Lodges over which you preside. You are an integral part of this Communication. I extend a special welcome to all who are here for the first time, and most especially those Master Masons, Fellows and Apprentices who have come out even though they don't get to vote. Bravo brethren.

It is wonderful to welcome the distinguished guests from our sister Grand Jurisdictions. We have worked together at the All Canada and North America Conferences, sharing ideas and advice. Several of you have welcomed Jill and me to your Grand Jurisdictions, and I hope you find this visit worth the trip.

And I welcome also the representatives of our Concordant and Appendant Bodies, leaders in their own right and supporters of Craft Masonry. And to our Past Grand Masters, Board members, Grand Representatives, and all those who year after year, come out to support your Grand Lodge. You are the glue of this organization.

There are several functions that the Grand Master's address should fulfill. First, it is a summary of the Grand Master's activities and the way to meet certain reporting requirements. Secondly, it provides an opportunity to recognize, acknowledge and pay tribute to those who have contributed in exceptional ways. And lastly, it is an opportunity for the Grand Master to inspire the brethren as to the future direction they may wish to take.

But it is only appropriate at the start of this particular address to report on some Extraordinary Correspondence:

In February, on behalf of the Masons of Ontario, I sent a letter of congratulation to Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, on the Seventieth Anniversary of Her Majesty's Accession to the Throne. I told Her Majesty that it is usual and customary at our lodge banquets to offer a toast to the Queen and the Craft, and this year we will do so with this milestone in mind. In response, The Queen "sends her best wishes to you all for a most enjoyable Platinum Jubilee year."

God Save The Queen.

Accomplishments during my term:

Wee, sleeket, cowran, tim'rous beastie, O, what a panic's in thy breastie! Thou need na start awa sae hasty, Wi' bickerin brattle!

I wad be laith to rin an' chase thee Wi' murd'ring pattle!

But Mousie, thou art no thy-lane, In proving foresight may be vain: The best laid schemes o' Mice an' Men Gang aft agley,

Bro. Robert Burns compared the plans of men to a mouse whose nest was dug up by the plow. And yet, he goes on to say that, despite the tribulation she had suffered, *Still, thou art blest*.

Brethren, we, too, are blessed.

Oh, I had laid some fine plans: visits to every district, twenty centennials and an equal number of 150<sup>th</sup> anniversaries, presentations, speeches, banquets, maybe even some dances, World Conferences, trips to Cuba and Jamaica, Scotland and England. Instead my job became to relay and explain public health advice, interpret legislative regulations, keep the brethren safe by encouraging virtual contact only, and in spite of all this, keep the spirits of the brethren up.

In the past I had been asked what the most important character trait of a potential Worshipful Master is, and my answer was always "flexibility". Meetings never go exactly as planned. Ritualists fall ill, the air conditioning doesn't work, you find yourself obligating the Master-elect before moving to the second degree. We cope with it and move forward with lessons learned. No sense dwelling on it.

And as a Grand Lodge we were flexible. And we were blessed.

When the COVID-19 pandemic closed down lodge meetings we rapidly pivoted to virtual gatherings. Grand Lodge had set up a GoToMeeting Account so Board Committees could meet without the long drives, especially during the snowy months. We were rapidly able to extend the service to lodges and districts. And they took advantage of it. There were speakers from around the world – so many that we never would have been able to afford to bring them all over for inperson lectures. We also used it to socialize, with not only our shut-in brethren but those who had moved away to other towns, provinces and countries. And the quality of our speakers attracted a following from interested brethren from around the world, whom we got to know as well.

Another blessing was that we had time to reflect and refocus. The Board took the downtime to revamp programs and procedures. We went from "all lodges should do this program; why aren't they all doing it?" to targeted activities like the Lodge Secretary Workshops and Manual. We had time to devote to the Office Technology revamp.

We built bridges with other Grand Lodges and other fraternities.

We embarked on mutual recognition with neighbouring Prince Hall Grand Lodges. Last year the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania responded. This year, the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Minnesota and Its Jurisdiction has requested recognition. And, by chance, the Chairman of the Recognition Committee of the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of the District of Columbia heard about our endeavours and they have requested it as well.

Aware that other fraternal organizations are having similar financial constraints, and with no intent to ever recognize, merge or inter-visit, we have been opening the door to the mutual benefit of sharing buildings. There are now Order of Women Freemasons lodges who rent space from us. There is an Odd Fellows lodge that uses one of our buildings and a couple of our lodges that use Odd Fellows Halls.

We have trimmed the length of our annual communication to be more affordable to the average Mason, and we have moved to on-line elections to allow brethren from across this great province to have equal input. Although we didn't intend to change venues quite yet, we were flexible when forced by financial and booking constraints to do so this year. I hope the changes we have instituted, both as a result of the work of our Annual Communication Task Force and of necessity, are well received. Further honing of this event will in the future see us move around the province like we did up until 85 years ago.

We strove to be more universally respectful by tweaking our ritual and by embracing the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act.

We sat at home, wishing we could go to lodge. But it was an opportunity to reflect on what it was about lodge that was so appealing. And the break was an opportunity to start afresh.

Many of you will recall the story I told in several of my virtual talks: about the young man whose horse ran away. Everyone tried to offer consolation for the man's ill fortune, but his father said, "What makes you so sure this is not a blessing?" His mare returned accompanied by a beautiful stallion and everyone said "What good fortune!" That is, until he fell while riding the stallion and broke his hip, then everyone commiserated with him. But the wise old man asked "What makes you so sure this is a disaster?" Eventually the town was threatened by invaders but the young man could not go into battle due to his disability. Because of this he survived to live a long life, and father and son could look after each other.

These past two years have been incredibly challenging, some would say a disaster. But what makes you so sure it was not a blessing?

#### R.W. Bro. S. Michael Jenkyns, FCF, PGSW (Hon)

Grand Historian 2009-2021 A prolific author, Michael Jenkyns served as our Grand Historian for many years. His keen interest in the history of not only Craft Masonry, but also that of concordant bodies, has left a great legacy so that the brethren of the future may know and appreciate the past.

R.W. Bro. Thomas W. Jackson PGScy (Hon) 2001. World-wide Freemasonry lost a beacon in the person of Tom Jackson. Past Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, and Past Executive Secretary and Honorary President of the World Conference of Regular Masonic Grand Lodges; a promoter of Observant Masonry and of dialogue between Grand Lodges of differing obediences around the world. Although reserved and humble, when he spoke people listened. Because what he had to say rang true.

W. Bro. Jim Kramer, FCF passed to the Grand Lodge Above at the young age of 49. Despite a physical challenge which necessitated the use of an electric wheelchair and made it hard to understand his speaking, with the assistance of his brethren he served as Worshipful Master of Moffat Lodge No. 399 in London.

#### CONSECRATION OF NEW LODGE

On July 9, 2022 Heredom Lodge No. 749 was Constituted and Consecrated in due and ancient form at the Weston Masonic Temple. We welcome this third lodge in our Grand Jurisdiction to declare itself an Observant lodge. I know there are other lodges which are using a similar model to enhance the experience of candidates and members alike and I encourage all Masons to explore the precepts of this concept.

#### CONFERENCES

The Conference of Grand Masters of Canada (the "All Canada Conference") was held again virtually and even so, is an important opportunity to share with our brethren across the nation. This year we particularly discussed the issues we feel are important to address as we re-open.

#### DONATIONS

While my emphasis has been on Ritual, Education and Mentoring, it is obvious that if one lives the lessons of our craft, one will be moved to practice charity and benevolence. The Grand Master's discretionary fund was used to help the brethren of British Columbia after the wildfires and floods, and for humanitarian aid in Ukraine. Many individual brethren, as well as lodges and districts, also responded to these and many other worthy causes. And, of course, the Benevolence Committee and the Masonic Foundation of Ontario continued their valuable work.

#### DECISIONS OF THE GRAND MASTER

I have granted permission under Section 150 (b) of the Constitution for Lodge Niagara No. 360 of The Order of Women Freemasons to use the Niagara Masonic Memorial Temple craft lodge room for their meetings and ceremonials.

Under the same section I have granted permission for the Odd Fellows to use the rooms of North Dundas Lodge No. 320.

#### DISCIPLINE

Because of COVID protocols limiting gatherings I had to make some difficult rulings but I tried in all cases to minimize the disruption to the Craft. There is a long-standing prohibition against holding a Masonic Memorial Service at the graveside. A complaint was received against two brothers who participated in such a graveside service while knowing that the Grand Master had directed that such a service not occur. Due to the circumstances, I felt that it would not be in the best interests of the Craft for the complaint to proceed to a trial and so dismissed the complaint and reprimanded the brethren. Several other complaints and appeals were dealt with by the Discipline Committee. More details can be found in their Report.

#### GRAND MASTER'S BANQUET

We were to have had Bro. Robert Cooper as our speaker at the Grand Master's banquet tonight however, he has not been able to get here from Scotland, so you are stuck with me. Luckily I've had two years to come up with ideas for speeches and few chances to present them.

Dear R.W. Sir:

The position of Event Coordinator is responsible for lending support to the district through on-going communications with the lodges concerning DDGM Official Visits, Installations, and Social Events.

Throughout this masonic year, many lodges have remained communicative concerning the details of their meetings with the rest of the district. This has been widespread practice when it comes to the distribution of summonses, however we have also made an effort to have information on the district calendar leading up to Official Visits. When keeping up to date on Official Visits, each lodge has responded efficiently and positively. Each of the Official Visit's details for when the lodge tyles, festive board takes place, and RSVP contacts were received promptly, and communicated to the webmaster, at the very least, two weeks before. In addition, the District Secretary also communicated these details to the district via e-mail. I expect the same response as the Installation season nears.

Concerning social events, many lodges have reached out to me to help distribute the details of their events. A few lodges even remained in the conversation and contributed further by communicating regular updates to me so that the website did not display any out-of-date information. A practice I hope all lodges put into action.

This year I did not receive any complaints or confusion directly concerning the details of DDGM Official Visits or Social Events

I also helped in providing a schedule for the district's travelling gavel, which this year was disappointing. Firstly, there were three overlaps with Official Visits this year, and two of them were back-to-back nights in February for Temple and St. John's. Placing a burden on

Temple Lodge as they were expected to bring in four delegations on their Official Visit. There were also several instances of lodges either barely having the Gavel for a few days, or the opposite, a lodge holding it for more than a month. I still believe that lodges that meet at the Ottawa Masonic Centre on Walkley Road should not deliver it to other lodges meeting there, with the same rules applying to the Westboro Masonic Hall. Going forward, the schedule should be drawn up keeping in mind the best interests of the brethren, not to make visitation a chore. I take responsibility for an unsatisfactory schedule because I prioritized rushing to finish the schedule quickly rather than doing it well.

As the District Chairman of Grand Lodge Programs, my role is to oversee Grand Lodge initiatives in the District such as Brother-to-Brother and Friend-to-Friend. I'd like to start off with a bit of history regarding the recognition of the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons, Province of Ontario and Jurisdiction.

Our Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario formally recognized Prince Hall at the annual meeting of Grand Lodge on Wednesday, July 16, 2008. Our own Past Grand Master, the late, Most Worshipful Brother, Donald H. Mumby was very involved in the process of recognition.

After discussions with our Grand Lodge and the Secretary of the Prince Hall Grand Lodge, I was given the name and contact information of the Master here in Ottawa, Brother Randy Borde. It

### Beechwood Cemetery - Masonic Burial Plot

### A History of The Ottawa Masonic Burial Plot in Ottawa, Ontario at Beechwood Cemetery

The Masonic lodge system was first developed to, among other things, help, socially, and in benevolence toward its members and families. In 1855 in Ontario, when our Grand Lodge was formed, there was no public safety net within our communities in which anyone could rely. This was one of the prime motivators for those who joined the fraternity. Charity was, and is, an important concept taught to everyone who is initiated into the Order.

Up until the early 1960s Canadians, for the most part, had no official help from public sources. Taking notice of Saskatchewan's health care reforms, brought about by Tommy Douglas's provincial government, the federal government under John Diefenbaker put together a national health care plan that was finally instituted by the next government leader, Lester Pearson.


Freemasons believe in charity, and the greatest form of charity, one mason toward another, is to aid in the final disposition of a brother's mortal remains when he has gone to the Grand Lodge Above.

In modern times it is hard to imagine the hardship placed on families in those times when tasked with the preparation and transportation of the dead for a journey even to the next town prior to the widespread use of the automobile. The lack of understanding of disease transmission even led to an Ottawa Ordinance to only allow cemeteries to allow burials outside the boundaries of the city. This added even further complexity to the problem. Even a cemetery, previously in Sandy Hill, was moved primarily the bodies ended up at Beechwood Cemetery, which was just outside the municipal boundary at the time. It stood to reason that local masons would step in to help avoid the forced impoverishment and distress of relatives when entrusted with a brother's care.

The Ottawa Masonic Board of Relief was constituted with the enactment of its bylaws on December 3, 1875. It helped masons and their families through many concerns, also including taking care of an indigent mason's burial when entrusted to their care. In January 1876 the Board bought the land in the then new Beechwood Cemetery, which had been previously established in 1873, known as the "Masonic Burial Plot", costing \$350. The first burial seems to have happened in grave number 1, two years later. It is likely Beechwood was selected since most local masonic lodges met in down-town Ottawa and the cemetery had its office on Sparks Street, in the heart of the city. Interestingly, while never a mason, Tommy Douglas also rests in another part of Beechwood Cemetery.

The idea of establishing a District-wide Masonic Burial Plot was not original to Ottawa, however our example pre-dates the pattern of similar likenesses found in Toronto and Sarnia. The initiative seems to have originated in the United States in the latter half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The earliest I have found of this masonic practice was a monument found in New York State unveiled in 1872.

The Masonic Burial plot at Beechwood is in section 37, lot number 83. It is 20 feet (6.1m) East to West and 50 feet (15.2m) North to South. It has been used exclusively for indigent masons since its start. Name markers are not part of the service provided by the Board to protect the privacy of a brother who may have distressingly died in poverty. There have been newspaper reports, probably placed by family members, reporting specific burials and one family has had a marker placed in the grass and in one other case, at the expense of her family, the wife of a departed brother, after pre-deceasing her, had her ashes deposited next to him. These are exceptions to our long-held practice of not publicly identifying those within the gravesite or joining other family members. While the Plot has space for 24 full casket burials, only cremated remains are interred, thereby making room for 750, all placed in an Easterly orientation. There are fewer than 100 in total laid to rest at the plot as of the end of 2022. Most of them prior to the 1940s. There have been a few, however, laid to rest there into the 20-teens.



On Thursday, May 31, 1888, at the conclusion of a Grand Lodge Communication, held at the Byward Market Building in Ottawa the Deputy Grand Master led a large delegation of masons and their families to Beechwood Cemetery to unveil a monument on the plot land.

The report discovered in the **Ottawa Citizen** of Friday, June 1 states:

"The scheme of a Beechwood burial plot was incepted by the late Right Worshipful Bro. Kerr, who, in conjunction Bro. E. D. Parlow, Chairman of the Burial Plot Committee, and Bro. S. W. H. Baldwin, Secretary Treasurer, were largely instrumental in carrying the scheme to a successful issue, being ably assisted by the following brethren, also members of the committee, viz:

H. P. Webb, **Builders Lodge**, A. Walsh, **Prince of Wales**, A. Perriton, **Eddy Lodge**, W. C. Teague, **Fidelity**, And, Thomas Kennedy, **Chaudière** Lodge



Some dozen of the deceased brotherhood have already been buried in the plot. The extra cost of the plot and monument is in the vicinity of \$2000 (almost \$63000 in 2023 dollars). It is one of the most tasteful and imposing structures in the cemetery and is composed of two heavy granite bases surmounted by stonework bearing the words "Masonic Burial Plot" and various emblems of the Order, upon which rests the altar, with a volume of the sacred law open thereon, surrounded by four polished red granite columns, which support the upper part, upon also are inscribed various which emblems. The whole is surmounted by a Polished granite globe symbolic of the university of masonry."

Reports of the unveiling of the 13 feet (4m) tall by 4 feet (1.2m) wide, monument at the Masonic Burial Plot, as well as the consecration of new lodge facilities and an "At Home" held on the same day, can also be found in the **1888 Grand Lodge Proceedings:**

In addition to the ceremonies of Consecration and Dedication reported

herewith, a large number of brethren assembled in the afternoon of the same day and went out to Beechwood Cemetery where the beautiful monument on the Masonic Burial Plot was unveiled, and an excellent address was given to the brethren and the public present by R. W. Bro. Walkem. In the evening of the same day an "At Home " was held in the Masonic Hall, attended by fully a thousand friends of the brethren. The day's proceedings wound up with a banquet in honor of Grand Lodge.

Probably the most important Masonic event of the year, so far as the Capital is concerned, was the consecration and dedication of the new Masonic Hall, on May 31st. A special communication of Grand Lodge was held, and in the presence of over two hundred city and visiting brethren, R. W. Bro. R. T. Walkem, D. G. M., performed the solemn duties devolving upon him in a most impressive manner. The new Temple, for such it may well be designated, was built by Bro. E. Wallace, and has been leased from him by the city Lodges for the term of ten years. It contains a large Lodge room, handsomely furnished, with commodious anterooms, refreshment room, lavatories, etc., in fact possesses every convenience, and is certainly a hall of which the Ottawa District have every reason to be proud. Later in the day, R. W. Bro. Walkem, attended by a large number of brethren, proceeded to Beechwood cemetery, and there in the presence of several hundred spectators the acting Grand Master unveiled the beautiful monument recently erected on the Masonic burial plot.

In the evening an "At Home " was held in the new hall, at which about a thousand Masons and their lady friends were present. Subsequently a banquet was tendered by the R. W. the acting Grand Master, at the Grand Union Hotel, (This appears to be the same building found at the corner of Sparks St. and Elgin today.) and at which nearly one hundred and fifty brethren sat down. The affair was a great success and was a fitting termination of a memorable day's work. At the different assemblages R. W. Bro. Walkem delivered earnest practical addresses which will long be remembered by those who heard them. This was Bro. Walkem's first official visit to Ottawa, and by his genial disposition, his knowledge of Craft lore, and the ability with which he fulfilled all the important duties devolved upon him, he entirely won the hearts of all the brethren.

Other details of note include the purchase of perpetual care for the site in 1921. Also, very interestingly, after the unveiling, and at least until the 1930s, where there is a sporadic journalistic record, that every year, on June  $24^{th}$  (St. John Baptiste Day – who is the patron saint of Freemasonry) the local brethren would have a remembrance service at the plot in memory of our past brethren.

June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023, dispensation was received and Lodge of Fidelity 231 hosted a 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary Remembrance Service at the Masonic Plot. The Cemetery has further booked the Sunday closest to June 24<sup>th</sup> moving forward for this tradition to continue.

He was elected to the first council for Bytown in 1847 and became Mayor in 1848. After Bytown was renamed to Ottawa in 1854, he became its first Mayor. He was Police Commissioner for the city in 1863. In 1872, he was elected to the House of Commons as a Conservative in the two-member riding of Ottawa City. He died in Ottawa in 1874. He is interred at Beechwood Cemetery.

## Regular Meeting Summons, November 15, 2022

Remembrance Day is commemorated on November 11th each year and marks the end of World War I in 1918. It may also be commonly known as Armistice Day.

On Remembrance Day, Canadians pause to honour the men and women who have served and continue to serve Canada during times of war, conflict, and peace. More than 2,300,000 Canadians have served and more than 118,000 made the ultimate sacrifice. The intention of the day is to remember the fallen on both sides in the Great War (first world war).

The reason that the poppy is worn for Remembrance Day is due to a Canadian physician and poet who noticed how quickly poppies had grown over the graves of soldiers who had died during the Battle of Ypres. This symbolism of the blood-red flowers was beautifully captured by Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae in his 1915 poem "In Flanders Fields." The poem was apparently discarded by McCrae but was found by soldiers who sent it to a London- based magazine named Punch.

In 1921, people began wearing the poppy three years after the war ended. The poppy is the symbol of Remembrance Day.

November 11th marks the signing of the armistice (peace agreement) between the Allies and Germany at Compiegne, France. The armistice took effect at eleven o'clock in the morning - the "eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month."

Brethren, Let Remembrance Day be a time to pause and reflect on the hardships and the ultimate sacrifices made on our behalf by so many which have provided us with the freedoms we enjoy today.



## **Appendix A - Grand Lodge Communications**

## Royal Letter to the Lodges - Issued September 12, 2022



Grand Lodge of A.F. & A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario Grand Master

#### Royal Letter to the Lodges 2022

It is with profound sadness and a heavy heart that Masons throughout our jurisdiction and beyond mourn the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Her passing raises a number of questions as it relates to Masonry, which I will address herein.

#### Our Head of State

His Majesty King Charles III is the head of state in Canada which is a member of the British Commonwealth. His Majesty King Charles III was officially proclaimed Canada's monarch on Saturday in a ceremony in Ottawa.

#### British National Anthem

It is no longer appropriate to sing God save the Queen.

The Lodge may sing the British National Anthem in the accepted lyrics, which are: God save our gracious King!

Long live our noble King! God save the King! Send him victorious, Happy and glorious, Long to reign over us,

God save the King.

Government restrictions on singing have been removed. Singing is therefore at the discretion of the Lodge. Grand Lodge recommends caution be observed when singing, especially in tight quarters or where large numbers are in attendance.

#### Toasting the King

His Majesty King Charles III is the King of Canada. On formal occasions, particularly formal dinners, it is customary to toast His Majesty at a suitable point in the proceedings.

The following is the usual procedure:

After the meal entre has been cleared and before dessert has been served, the host or the toastmaster rises and asks for the attention of those present so that they may rise and join in a toast. Once all have risen, the toastmaster raises his glass and says: 'The King and the Craft' without any other words and without music. Those present respond:

The King and the Craft', drink the toast and sit. It is not appropriate to click glasses. For non-formal dinners, it is acceptable to make the toast prior to the meal. Generally, any non-alcoholic beverage may be used. However, it is preferred to drink the toast with water.

The toast to 'The King and the Craft' is always the first toast to be proposed. No other toasts should be proposed until the toast to 'The King and the Craft' has been made.

#### Draping the Warrant

It is not appropriate to drape the Warrant in our jurisdiction for the passing of a head of state.

The only time it is appropriate to drape any Warrant in our jurisdiction is in strict compliance with a formal written notification from Grand Lodge (e.g. on the passing of a Past Grand Master).

#### Moment of silence for Queen

It is acceptable to include Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in a moment of silence as part of a Masonic program.

Grand Lodge recommends including departed brethren in the moment of silence.

#### Pictures of Queen

Pictures of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II may remain hanging in the Craft Lodge room at the discretion of the Lodge and any Masonic entity having the management or control over the Craft Lodge room.

#### Draping a picture of Queen

Lodges are permitted to drape pictures of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in a Craft Lodge room during the official mourning period in Canada.

#### **Pictures of King**

Pictures of His Majesty King Charles III may be hung in Craft Lodge rooms if permitted by the Lodge and any Masonic entity having the management or control over the Craft Lodge room.

#### Flags in Craft Lodge room

It is not appropriate to fly any flag in the Craft Lodge room at the half-mast position. Flags shall, at all times, be displayed appropriately in the Craft Lodge room and shall not be partially lowered and/or draped in any manner.
